“¹² For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ.”

One of the questions that I have been asked since taking the Interim AMS position has been “What are the benefits of the local Baptist associations?” Over the next two months I want to address just a few of those. Today, I will start with these two: fellowship and discipleship.

I believe one of the greatest benefits of local associations is the fellowship of believers that associations offer. Just since the beginning of the year there have been three examples of the importance of fellowship among local believers that I have had the privilege of participating in or witnessing.

First, in January, we held the annual Pastor/Spouse Christmas Dinner in Sanford. Barry Lawrence and I stood at the end and watched the extended time of fellowship the pastors were having with one another. Even more impressive to us was the conversations and fellowship that was taking place among the spouses. A local association affords pastors and their families opportunities to get together with others that know what they are going through. Pastors, if you were not a part of the Christmas dinner, you missed an opportunity for your wives to be with the only other group of people who know what they are experiencing – other pastor’s wives.

Second, in March we had our quarterly Senior Adult Luncheon. It is through associational events like this that our members have the opportunity to get together and fellowship with one another. It was a joy to see so many members from different churches sharing the stories of what God has been doing in their lives and catching up with family and friends they haven’t seen since the last quarterly luncheon.

Third, also in March, the association hosted a Women’s Bible Journaling Workshop with Lauren Rayfield leading. The workshop was at East Sanford Baptist, so I had the privilege of observing small portions of the day’s events. During the breaks, the ladies would travel from table to table to talk with one another; some sharing stories of what God was doing in their lives and others showing off pictures of children and grandchildren.

While it is possible for churches to get together and do things together without a local association, the local Baptist association certainly makes it easier for those opportunities to occur.

Another benefit that we will talk more about next month is discipleship. The local association provides great opportunity for us to help one another grow in our Christ walk. Proverbs 27:17 says, “Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another.” The local association offers classes, training events, cohorts, etc., where we have the opportunity to disciple one another. I will have more on this next month.

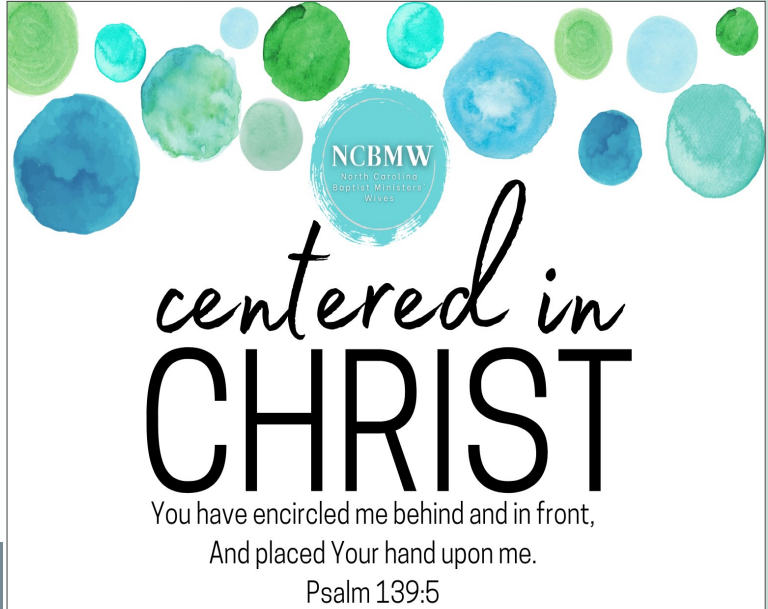
